

# Pvt. Cary, Troy, 11th Man from Area to Die on Korea Battlefield

The Korean war has claimed the life of an 11th Albany Metropolitan area man. He is Army Pvt. Daniel A. Cary, 18, formerly of 3320 Seventh avenue, Troy.

His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Joseph W. Cary, who now reside on the North Greenbush road, received a telegram from the Defense department Sunday night.

THE TELEGRAM STATED that Pvt. Cary was killed August 31. The only letter his parents received from him since he arrived in Korea early in August, disclosed that he was a member of Co. C, Fifth Regimental Combat Team.

He enlisted in the Army May 12,

1949, and was sent to Fort Dix, N. J., for basic training. He attended St. Augustine's School and School 1, Troy. He was employed at the Trojan Maid company, and prior to entering service, at the Rototiller, Inc. plant.

Survivors, in addition to his par-

ents, include two sisters, Miss Beverly E. Cary and Miss Eleanor Gladys Cary, and a brother, Joseph C. Cary.

There have been 31 wounded, 13 missing, and one prisoner of war from the Albany Metropolitan area as a result of the Korean war to date.

## Pvt. Daniel Cary Killed In Action At War Front

The son of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph W. Cary of the North Greenbush Road, Pvt. Daniel A. Cary, 18, has been killed in action in Korea.

Notification was received by his parents on Sunday night in a Defense Department telegram.

Private Cary is the second Trojan reported killed in action in the Korean war. Pvt. John F.

Mahar, 19, of Pleasantdale, was the first.

Private Cary was killed Aug. 31, the telegram stated. The only letter his parents received from him since he arrived in Korea early in August, disclosed that he was a member of Co. C, Fifth Regimental Combat Team.
